Curriculum Changes Continue Momentum

SIUE has adopted a new general education program called the Lincoln Program. This new program will be implemented in phases starting in Fall 2012 with full implementation effective Fall 2015.

We are in the process of mapping existing SIUE courses to the newly structured general education program. Once those decisions are complete, all currently articulated transfer equivalent classes will be flagged for recognition in meeting the same requirements.

We recognize that some transfer students are following our existing general education requirements as they plan their future transfer to SIUE. We are working toward ensuring that those students will not be disadvantaged by our transition to the Lincoln Program. More information will be made available regarding our efforts to assist transfer students in the transition. In addition, **consistent with our current practice, students transferring with an earned AA or AS or completion of the IAI GECC will have met all lower division general education requirements.**

Undergraduate Research and Creative Activities

SIUE offers undergraduate students the opportunity to engage in a research project or creative endeavor under the guidance of a faculty mentor through the Undergraduate Research and Creative Activities (URCA) program. This experience allows students to work closely with faculty on a faculty led or student driven research project.

The program allows undergraduate students a chance to build a solid relationship with a faculty member and experience what many students only can receive at the graduate level.

This past year, students engaged in projects such as “the evaluation of sedum cuttings for green roofs” and “ceramic china painting on wood fired surfaces.” Also, more than 40 students were co-authors for their scientific presentations having their works published, and many students were selected to present at national conferences.

Students selected for this program can receive credit as well as the possibility of various amounts of award dollars for their time and work. Overall, the program allows students the opportunity to get involved immediately in their undergraduate career gaining invaluable experience that they can utilize for their future goals.

Admission Information

Admission Criteria

Students who have attempted at least 30 semester hours at accredited institutions are admissible in good standing, provided they have earned a minimum cumulative 2.00(C) GPA. Students who have attempted fewer than 30 semester hours are admitted in good standing if they have a cumulative 2.00(C) GPA and meet the current freshman admission requirements.

Application Fee Waivers

Recognizing that the application fee might be an obstacle to some students pursuing a college education, SIUE will waive the fee for students who meet specific criteria. Students may complete the application fee waiver form at: siue.edu/apply/pdf/AppFeeWaiverForm.pdf.

The student may qualify if the student's family receives public assistance, the student is a ward of the state, the student lives in a foster home, the student participates in the free or reduced lunch program at the school, or the student's total family income is at or below the maximum amounts established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics' Low Standard Budget.

The School of Business offers four undergraduate degree programs:

Admission to the School of Business is through a selective, competitive application process. Students must complete a supplemental application to the School of Business. The minimum cumulative combined GPA required to apply is 2.25 on a 4.0 scale. For summer term, students must pass all prerequisite courses by the end of the preceding spring semester; for fall semester, students must pass all prerequisite courses by the end of the preceding summer term; for spring semester, students must pass all prerequisite courses the end of the preceding fall semester. Prerequisites that students must complete with a grade of C or better are: English Composition I and II, Public Speaking, Critical Thinking, Computer Concepts and Applications, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Financial Accounting, Modern Non-U.S. History, American Government, College Algebra (or Pre-calculus) and Business Calculus or a regular calculus course. (Students who've been placed through exam or other methodology into a business calculus or a regular calculus course and completed it with a grade of C or higher do not have to take college algebra or pre-calculus.) The School of Business seeks to admit students who demonstrate the greatest likelihood of success. Admission decisions are based primarily on the student's performance in collegiate-level work as well as the required essay. In recent admission cycles, the average prerequisite GPA of the students admitted was 3.0, the average combined cumulative GPA of the students admitted was 3.0. Application Deadlines: February 1 for summer term and fall semester; October 3 for spring semester.

Admission Requirements

Students admitted to programs offered in the School of Engineering shall have met the University admission requirements and the following additional requirements:

- completion of all Academic Development courses required by the University;
- completion of any courses required to address School of Engineering high school deficiencies;
- eligibility to enroll in Pre-Calculus (MATH 125) at a minimum;
- maintenance of a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale).

NOTE: Although SIUE may accept a "D" for transfer credit, the School of Engineering will not accept a "D" grade for any engineering, math, physics, chemistry or computer science course.

The School of Nursing offers the following undergraduate options for a bachelor of science degree in Nursing:

TRADITIONAL OPTION - PROGRAM FOR LICENSURE

This option is designed for first degree-seeking students and is offered at the main campus in Edwardsville and at our regional site on the Carbondale campus. It is offered at the Edwardsville campus in primarily a traditional format. Graduates of this option are eligible to take the NCLEX-RN examination for licensure as a registered nurse.

SIUE NURSING REGIONAL PROGRAM - CARBONDALE CAMPUS

The Edwardsville and Carbondale campuses have joined forces to address a statewide nursing shortage. The regional program is identical to the curriculum offered on the Edwardsville campus (Traditional Option). Admission criteria are the same for both campuses. At Carbondale, select classes will be offered via tele-education between the two campuses; others will be taught face-to-face. SIUE nursing faculty will teach classes at Carbondale and will provide clinical supervision of the nursing students in the Carbondale area. The B.S. degree will be conferred by SIUE.

ACCELERATED OPTION

This option allows students with a bachelor's degree in another field to attain a B.S. degree with a major in Nursing in 15 months. Course work and clinical experiences are of the same high quality as the traditional first-degree baccalaureate option, but are taken at an accelerated pace. This option is offered at the main campus in Edwardsville. Accelerated students pay differential tuition and fees as approved by the SIUE Board of Trustees.

RN TO BS OPTION

This option is designed for graduates of associate degree and diploma programs. It is offered on-line (85%) on a part-time format to accommodate the needs of working RN's. Transfer students follow the same criteria and procedures for admission as the SIUE students. Anyone seeking admission whose prerequisite courses were taken at other colleges or universities must submit official transcripts to the Office of Admissions at SIUE. In addition, course descriptions and/or course syllabi may be requested.

Pre-dental Requirements

The minimum academic requirements for admission to the School of Dental Medicine are as follow: The prerequisite is successful completion of two academic years — 60 semester or 90 quarter hours — of undergraduate course work, which includes the specified subjects, at an accredited college or university in the United States, Puerto Rico or Canada. The majority of accepted applicants complete a minimum of 90 semester or 135 quarter hours. The stipulation of two years of undergraduate work is a absolute minimum. However, exceptional candidates with minimal requirements and showing outstanding academic attainment are encouraged to apply. Required subjects or equivalents are:

- * **Inorganic Chemistry** 6 semester or 9 quarter hours
- ~ * **Organic Chemistry** 4 semester or 6 quarter hours
- * **Biology/Zoology** 6 semester or 9 quarter hours
- * **Physics** 6 semester or 9 quarter hours
- * **English** 6 semester or 9 quarter hours
- * *These courses must include laboratory and lecture instruction.*
- ~ *6 semester or 9 quarter hours are preferred.*

The remainder of the Pre-dental program should be designed to contribute a broad cultural background; however, the program should not exclude courses related to the SDM curriculum such as biochemistry, anatomy, microbiology, physiology, genetics, etc.

It is possible that a tentative acceptance may be extended subject to fulfillment of these requirements; however, all course requirements, as proposed by the applicant, must be met in full before admission is granted. All academic admission requirements must be completed by July 1, prior to the desired date of matriculation. As a state-supported institution, the SDM gives priority to Illinois residents from Illinois institutions.

With a target enrollment of 330 students, the school admits 80-83 students per year. The program will

accept qualified students from an accredited community college, college or university who have completed a defined preprofessional curriculum. All course equivalencies for Illinois community colleges are available on the School of Pharmacy website.

The SIUE School of Pharmacy program is a four-year professional curriculum. The first three years consist of study on the SIUE campus; year four consists of eight, five-week clinical rotations arranged by the SIUE School of Pharmacy Office of Experiential Education. Students should begin the application process one year before their intended start date. Applications must be submitted via PharmCAS, the pharmacy school common application, at www.PharmCAS.org. The application requires that students submit personal information, an educational information summary, official copies of all college and university transcripts, letters of support, and scores from the Pharmacy College Admissions Test (PCAT). The deadline to apply for the program is November 1 for the following fall semester.
